# What is the Camping and Outdoor Program Committee?

The camping and outdoor program committee (COPC) is a leadership group entrusted with safely delivering the outdoor adventure that youth and adults expect and that lead to self-discovery and character development. The committee plans and oversees the council outdoor program and the facilities that are needed to support the programs.

# High Adventure Weekends

These weekends will feature high adventure activities and, adult training opportunities, and plenty of scout spirit! We want units to get to know each other and develop a sense of District and Council identity.

# Registration

Please register early to help us get an accurate head count for supplies. You can register in advance at the scout office. The flier is attached to this guide. The cost is \$25 per person which includes all ammunition, patches and lunch on Saturday. Registration will also be available on site, but please register early to help us plan sufficient supplies. Youth and adults must register.

# On-site check in

Unit leaders will check in on site like summer camp. They will be given a packet containing updated information about the events and wrist bands for each paid attendant. Wrist bands will be required for lunch and events. You may unload at campsite but you must park in main parking area – NO vehicles in camp. No vehicles will be allowed near the camping area during day's events.

#### A UNIT ROSTER OF ALL ATTENDEES WILL NEED TO BE PROVIDED UPON CHECK-IN. ALL UNITS MUST ALSO HAVE CURRENT MEDICAL FORMS WITH THEM DURING HIGH ADVENTURE WEEKENDS.

# Youth/Leaders Meeting

There will be a joint meeting of the Youth and Adult Leaders from all units Friday night at 9 PM. The Senior Patrol Leader and Scoutmaster; Crew President and Adviser; Ship Boatswain and Skipper; or Post/Club President and Advisor/Sponsor for your unit are asked attend the meeting for important updates and information. A cracker barrel will be provided. Venture crew members are the host and providing support during the weekend.

# Friday Night Movie

For those coming in on Friday night there will be a movie available to enjoy please check location upon arrival. We will be showing some high adventure movies in the training center next to the Dining Hall.

# Camping

Units will camp sites in pre-determined areas of camp. You will be assigned when you check in on Friday night. There will be no tents up in camp your unit must provide their own

tents. Units will be responsible for leaving their campsite clean and must plan to pack out all trash upon departure.

# **Cooking/fires**

Attended open fires will be allowed in the fire ring at your assigned campsite. Your unit responsible for all of your food for the weekend except for Saturday lunch. All food should be stored in sealed containers since there is plenty of hungry wildlife in the area.

# Uniforms

Field uniforms will be required at check-in, flags, campfire, Scout's Own, and departure. Activity uniforms may be worn at all other times based on the individual units' rules.

# Lunch

Lunch will be provided for all paid attendees. Non-registered visitors may purchase lunch for \$8 on site. Please bring appropriate change

<u>GUN SAFETY TRAINING IS REQUIRED FOR ANYONE WHO IS PLAN TO SHOOT</u> <u>SHOTGUN DURING WEEKEND</u>. IF YOU DON'T ATTEND THE MANDATORY TRAINING YOU CANNOT SHOOT 7:30 – 8:45 Saturday morning at the Gun Range. You will be issues a colored ID bracelet once training is completed.

# <u>KAYAKING</u>

If participants are doing Kayaking they must be able to swim. Leaders must fill out the Unit Swim classification record. If participant did swim test at camp it is still good for this weekend. Those who did do test at camp must have it completed prior to coming to event. There will be no swim checks during this weekend. Form attached at end of this Leaders Guide.

# PLEASE READ CLEAN-UP & CHECK OUT

Before you leave camp each unit will be assigned an area to help clean up since camp will be closing. Once your unit has completed the assigned cleanup they can leave. If you are leaving Saturday night you will complete your assigned clean up prior to campfire or you leaving Saturday night. A campsite inspection will be required prior to departure. You will receive your unit participation ribbon and patches after camp site inspection. All units must be out of camp by 11:00 Sunday morning unless otherwise arranged to leave later.
