CAMPORALL 2019 LOGISTICS AND OPERATIONS

UNIFORM STANDARDS – BSA is a uniformed organization
Scouts & Scouters must abide by BSA standards as follows:

- Field Uniform: Travel to and from Camporall
- Field Uniform: Major assemblies such as Friday SPL Cracker barrel, Saturday morning Flags, Saturday evening Campfire, Sunday morning Flags and Interfaith Service, and departure.
- Activity Uniform: Crews, Patrols, Packs or Troops should be in a uniform t-shirt with pants or some form of “common look” clothes when not in Field Uniform.
- Camo pattern is NOT approved BSA uniform clothing.
- **Closed toe shoes are mandatory for all activities.**

PARKING REGULATIONS: The parking lot is located near the camp office and will be the main parking area.

- Units may have no more than **two** vehicles to do offloading of equipment at their designated campsite. **All offloading must be completed within 30 minutes of the unit checking in.** Following unloading of equipment all vehicles must be parked in the camp’s designated parking area until load out at end of Camporall. Vehicles who violate this policy will be towed from camp at owner’s expense. **NO vehicles will be allowed to remain at campsites** – This will be monitored by Camporall staff.
- **NO participant vehicles will be allowed into camp on Saturday** – service vehicles and Camporall support vehicles only
- Order of the Arrow members will direct drivers to designated campsite areas and parking areas.
- Vehicles must travel on designated roads only.
- All vehicles must be parked at the designated parking area, not troop campsites.
- Do not leave vehicles unattended in the traffic areas and car offloading.

CAMPING

Units will camp sites in pre-determined areas of camp. You will be assigned when you check in on Friday night. If a Troop and Pack are camping together, please identify that during the online registration process. Units will be responsible for providing their own tents. There will be no tent cabins set up during the Camporall. Units will be responsible for leaving their campsite clean and must plan to pack out all trash upon departure. **A LIMITED NUMBER OF CAMPSITES WITH TENTS WITH BEDS THAT SLEEP 2 PER TENT WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR CUB SCOUT UNITS WHO ARE NOT CAMPING WITH A SCOUT UNIT AND DON'T HAVE CAMPING EQUIPMENT. THESE ARE FOR CUB SCOUTS ONLY AND ON A FIRST COME BASIS WHILE AVAILIABLE.**

CHECK-IN (At Camp Office) An Adult leader for each unit must finalize registration for the unit.

REGISTRATION – At Friday check-in, the following items are Mandatory

- Turn in a separated roster of all attending both youth & adults.
- Medical Forms A and B, including releases. must be shown when checking in and be available at campsite (placement in a binder is suggested).
- **Provide – Appropriate Activity Participation Forms**
 - ✓ **California Rifle & Shotgun Parental/Legal Guardian Permission Form for each youth participant planning to shoot BB guns or Shotguns. NO PERMISSION FORM -- NO SHOOTING**

YOUTH/LEADERS MEETING

There will be a joint meeting of the Youth and Adult Leaders from all units Friday night at 9 PM at the Training Center. The Senior Patrol Leader and Scoutmaster; Cubmaster/leaders, Crew President and Adviser; Ship Boatswain and Skipper; or Post President and Advisor/Sponsor for your unit are asked to attend the meeting for important updates and information. A cracker barrel will be provided. Venture crew members are the host and providing support during the weekend. **THERE WILL BE A MEETING FOR ALL SHOOTING SPORTS STAFF AFTER THE YOUTH/LEADER MEETING**

SPECIAL NOTES:

THERE WILL BE A MEETING FOR ALL SHOOTING SPORTS STAFF AFTER THE YOUTH/LEADER MEETING

GUN SAFETY TRAINING IS REQUIRED FOR ANYONE WHO IS PLANNING TO SHOOT SHOTGUN DURING WEEKEND. IF YOU DON'T ATTEND THE **MANDATORY TRAINING** YOU CANNOT SHOOT. 7:30 AM – 8:45AM Saturday morning at the Training Center. You will be issued a colored ID wristband once training is completed. A parent/guardian signed California Rifle & Shotgun Parental/Legal Guardian Permission Form is also required.

FIRST AID – Call 911 for major medical needs

- The Health Lodge is located behind the training center for any First Aid issues. The Health Lodge will be staffed and open for all Camporall participants from 6am Saturday to 12 Noon Sunday.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES if loud bells ring – All units are to assemble at waterfront area immediately with all scouts and adults. Leaders please bring roster so you can check attendance.

TWO-DEEP LEADERSHIP REQUIRED PER BSA POLICY - It is **MANDATORY** that at least two adult leaders camp with their unit. Adult leaders must have proof of Youth Protection Training (YPT) on their person.

BUDDY SYSTEM

- **Scouts and leaders alike are to use the “Buddy System” at all times.** Do not leave and go anywhere by yourself and keep your buddy informed of your whereabouts.

RESTROOM FACILITIES

- All restrooms are unisex and must be kept clean. **Horseplay or vandalism in any bathroom will result in expulsion from CAMPORALL.** Hand washing units are available outside of each restroom.
- Scoutmasters must appoint a toilet monitor from your unit to make sure TP is in each restroom and that they are free of litter. Report malfunctions to Camperall office.

SHOWER ROOM FACILITIES

- All Shower facilities are unisex and have locking doors. **Horseplay or vandalism in any bathroom will result in expulsion from CAMPORALL. SHOWERS are not toilets; Leaders please stress this to you scouts.**
- Scoutmasters must appoint a shower monitor from your unit to make sure shower in area is free of litter. Report malfunctions to Camperall office.

MEALS

- All Units are expected to provide their own food and prepare their own meals during the Camporall.

CAMP AND COOKING FIRES

- **All campfires are restricted to established fire rings within your designated campsite.**
- Propane stoves are recommended for cooking.
- Improper campfire procedures may result in no campfire at your unit's campsite.

RESTRICTIONS

- Smoking, vaping, the use of tobacco products, alcohol, drugs, or controlled substances are **NOT ALLOWED** at Camp Chawanakee or in the presence of youth.

WATER – potable water is available throughout camp. You will find water spickets and fountains near restroom facilities. Washbasins are also available in the same locations.

TRASH AND GARBAGE -- “Pack It In, Pack It Out.” THANK YOU

- If trash receptacles are full, don't leave your trash on the ground, take it home. Each unit must provide their own trash bags and remove all refuse from their campsite. All trash must be hauled to the big dumpster near the Dining Hall. Restrooms and restroom trash receptacles are not for campsite trash.

PROHIBITIONS

- Camporall conforms to the Guide for Safe Scouting.
- NEITHER BULLYING NOR HAZING OF ANY KIND WILL BE TOLERATED
- SCOUTS ARE PROHIBITED from using the following items, which will be confiscated: Sheath Knives, electronic devices (Electronic Entertainment Devices, Televisions, Radios, Video Games, CD Players, MP3 Players, iPods, cell phones), Fireworks, and Firearms outside of the range. Confiscated items will be returned to the Scoutmaster or Unit leader.
- If a Scout needs to contact home, they should coordinate with their Scout leaders

SCOUT LEADERS

- Scouts are not to roam through other campsites. A scout may enter the camping area of another troop only by "asking for and receiving permission to enter."
- Scouts are expected to participate in the activities at the prescribed times. Campsites are off limits during activity times.
- Scouts are always expected to remain within the CAMPORALL area. Scouts must remain in their camping area and are not allowed to leave without permission of their Scout leader.
- All Scouts and their units are required to follow the principles of "Leave No Trace and the "Outdoor Code".
- No pets are allowed unless pre-authorized by CAMPORALL Chairman.
- Knives: No sheath knives! All Scouts who possess a knife while attending Camporall must have their Totin' Chit or Whittling Chip (Bear/Webelos) in their possession, otherwise, knives will be taken away.
- Destroying, trashing, vandalizing, or defacing the property of other Scouts, or any property of the BSA, will result in the offending scout's automatic dismissal from Camporall and his or her unit will be charged for the repairs.

TRADING POST

Scouts will need money if they wish to purchase extra supplies and/or snack food for the weekend. Bring quarters and one-dollar bills, please.

CAMPFIRE PROGRAM:

Saturday: We ask that every unit plan to attend the closing campfire. The program begins at 7 p.m. at Eagle Point Campfire Bowl. Units will line up outside the campfire area prior to 7:00 p.m. and will allowed in prior to start of the program. Skits and Songs performed by individual patrols or troops will keep us laughing. Venturing Officers Association will be Hosts.

Each Unit is expected to prepare in advance and sign up to present a Skit or a Song. The Sequoia Council Venturing Council leadership must approve all songs and skits prior to the Campfire.

EARLY CHECK OUT

If an individual or Unit must leave early for any reason, the Camporall Chairman must be notified. Notify the Camporall staff at Check In if your unit is planning to leave before Sunday morning.

INTERFAITH SERVICE: Meet at Chapel Sunday Morning. Assemble 8:45 a.m. – Service 9 a.m.

All Units are strongly encouraged to participate. We are looking on having a unit volunteer and they will receive instruction Friday night and will be involved in leading the Interfaith Service on Sunday morning.

CAMPWIDE CLEAN-UP (A Scout is Clean)

All units will help police the common areas of the campgrounds following the Sunday morning assembly. This project will only take about 30 minutes to complete if everyone pitches in.

DEPARTING INSPECTIONS

Contact Venturing staff at Training Center to have your campsite inspected to be litter-free. Staff will then give your unit the OK to leave your campsite. Hand in evaluation forms and your Camporall patches will be issued.

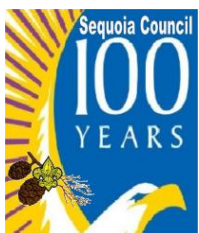

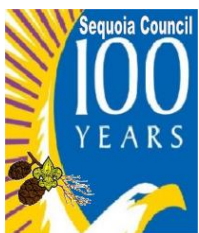
