## Univeristy of Scouting Courses

M/D	Course	Descriptions
M	Wilderness First Aid	Why most Scout / Venture Outdoor Activities should have trained Wilderness First Aid leaders. Why Wilderness First Aid Training is a helpful even when the Activity has a professionally trained MD, RN or EMT as part of the activity. How a Sequoia Council Scout leader may obtain Wilderness First Aid Training.
M	Outdoor Ethics Advancement & Awards	Presentation of BSA Outdoor Ethics Awards & Advancement. The Hornaday Badge may use a Conservation Oriented Eagle Scout Service Project to fulfill requirements.
M	Scouts with Disabilities	A 2007 AMA study showed that the cumulative incidence of definite ADHD based on DSM-IV criteria was 7.4% by age 19 years. Virtually every unit will experience having a youth who has Special Needs (Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (AD/HD), Autism or a form of disAbility). This course will provide unit leaders with the knowledge so they can provide a Scouting program and advancement opportunities, which provides these youth with the Scouting opportunities to succeed. Participants of this course will become familiar with the multiple characteristics common to individuals who have AD/HD; with the "Rules of Engagement" for advancement in each of the Scouting program areas; and with easy tips to help them to get the most out of the Scouting program areas to help them to respond to the needs of these special youth.
M	High Adventure Opportunities	Creating your own high adventure opportunities for your unit. In addition to Philmont, Florida sea base, The Summit, and Northern Tier.
D	Outdoor Ethics: Fun & Games	Lord Baden Powell called Scouting a game with a purpose. What better way to teach our youth BSA's Outdoor Ethics than through games? Learn OE games to teach both Leave No Trace and Tread Lightly! skills and principles that can be played at unit meetings or on campouts.
D	Camp Hygiene & Footcare on the Trail	Learn how to avoid foodborne and other illnesses in the wilderness or camp settings. Also, learn about proper Footcare routines for the trail and how to treat the most common foot problem--blisters.
M	Life to Eagle Process	The Eagle handbook. Electronic filing of the application. The project review process. Completing the project.
M	Appeals and Time Extensions	The appeals process, who to call. What may qualify for a time extension. The process for requesting an extension.
M	Order of the Arrow	Requirements to be inducted into the OA. Holding an election, rules OA Coucil participation. Opertunities in the OA.
M	Boards of Review	The goal of a board of review. Guidelines for conducting a review in your unit. An Eagle board primer.
D	Orienting New Parents	The world of Scouting can seem strange and confusing to new parents, even those who have been involved in Cub Scouting or who were Scouts themselves. This orientation is designed to give them the information they need to enjoy the program and help their youth succeed.
D	Webelos to Scout Transition & AOL	The transition from Cub Scouts to Boy Scouts is when we lose a large percentage of our membership. An effective Webelos to Scout Transition plan is essential for retaining our current Cub Scouts by moving them into a Boy Scout Troop.
M	Beginning with the end in mind, The Basic Scout Kit.	Enjoy more fun and less work by building an Outdoor program to improve your unit's recruitment, advancement, and retention. Equip your Scouts (and yourself) with an optimized and modern list of items to improve the quality of your Scouting experience.
M	Scoutmaster Training	REQUIRED: The purpose of Scoutmaster Position-Specific training is to provide an active, fun, and positive learning experience for new and experienced Scoutmasters to learn and apply proven techniques for running an effective Scout troop. Scoutmasters will learn how to meet the aims of Scouting by applying the eight methods of the Scouting program during the four main sessions of the course: • Patrol Method • Support Team • Advancement • Annual Planning
D	Cubmaster Training	REQUIRED: This course is intended to provide Cubmasters and assistant Cubmasters with the basic information they need to conduct successful pack meetings. The course is based on the seven parts of a pack meeting using the Pack Meeting Plans on <a href="http://www.Scouting.org/CubScouts">www.Scouting.org/CubScouts</a> .

M	Merit Badge Counselor	
M	Merit Badge Program	As a merit badge counselor, your mission is to join fun with learning. You are both a teacher and mentor as the Scout works on a merit badge and learns by doing. Your hands-on involvement could inspire a Scout to develop a lifelong hobby, pursue a particular career, or become an independent, self-supporting adult.
D	Family Scouting	Families can now choose Cub Scouts and Scouts, BSA for their sons and daughters, enabling them to take advantage of the life-changing experiences provided through Scouting. The BSA believes we owe it to families to structure our program offerings in a way that fits into their busy lives to deliver character development and values-based leadership training that Scouting promises.
M	Planning an Exciting Blue & Gold	Join us on how to plan and execute a fun and exciting Blue & Gold celebration for our Cub Scouts!
D	Unit Committee Challenge	REQUIRED: This course will provide the committee members of a Packs & Troops the basic information they will need to support a unit and ensure a successful program. Unit Committee Challenge has been developed to help committee members better understand their roles and responsibilities and help them deliver the promise of Scouting.
M	Venture Leader Specific	REQUIRED: This training is designed to introduce adult Venturing crew leaders to the basic information needed to operate a crew. The training is divided into five sessions: (1) Here's Venturing, (2) Understanding and Protecting Youth, (3) Leadership and Organization, (4) Awards and Recognitions, and (5) Resources and Program Planning.
M	Advancement/Scoutbook	Scoutbook is the BSA's online unit management tool and helps Scouts, parents and leaders track advancement and milestone achievements along the Scouting trail. As of January 1, 2019, Scoutbook subscriptions are free to all scouting units. Learn how to navigate their this great tool!
D	Den Leader Training	REQUIRED: The Den Leader Position-Specific Training course provides Cub Scout den leaders with the basic information they need to conduct successful den meetings.
D	Youth Protection	REQUIRED: The BSA is serious about fighting child abuse, and you're an important part of that fight. Youth Protection Training is required of all registered adults, including any adult who will be present at a Scouting activity for 72 total hours or more. YPT must be renewed every 2 years.
