Kings Co Sheriff Office EXPLORER COMMENDATION: Recently, KCSO Explorer Isaak Sauceda was recognized by the Hanford Police Department for his courageous actions during an arrest.

The incident began when HPD was dispatched to a report of a stolen vehicle being seen in the

area of 11th Avenue and Fargo Avenue. As Officers arrived three suspects ran from the stolen vehicle. The two officers on scene chased after two of the fleeing suspects.

The third suspect ran into a nearby neighborhood where he attempted to break into a residence. Explorer Sauceda was in the area in an unofficial capacity and spotted the suspect trying to break into the home.

Explorer Sauceda quickly realized the gravity of the situation. He grab ahold of the suspect, took him to the ground and detained him under citizen's arrest until HPD Officers arrived.

Explorer Sauceda's quick actions possibly saved a local family from having their home invaded. While KCSO does not encourage our Explorers to get involved in dangerous situations, the ramifications of failing to stop this suspect could have been devastating.



Hanford Police Sergeant Frank Martinez and Police Chief Jack Amaroso attended a recent Explorer Post meeting and presented Explorer Sauceda with a hard earned commendation.





A Winter Scouting Adventure Awaits.

It is time to start planning for the 2024 Klondike Derby to be held February 16-18, 2024, at Camp Chawanakee in Shaver Lake, California. This is the $32^{\rm nd}$ year that the Sequoia Council volunteers will host this great event commemorating the prospectors that sought their fortune in the Klondike gold rush of the Yukon Territory.

Troops and Crews from around California are invited to participate in this winter adventure. Camp Chawanakee will be transformed into the wild Yukon where scouts will traverse the frontier, traveling from town to town testing their scout skills, competing for gold, and demonstrating the Patrol Method. Start planning now for a great Scouting adventure.

Recommended Winter Awareness Training.

Success at the Klondike Derby is all about preparation. We will do our best to help you prepare your unit for this Scouting adventure. The winter awareness training held in years past has now been made available in a series of short training videos that can be viewed at your convenience. We recommend that the unit leader, assistant unit leaders, senior youth leaders, and other interested scouts or parents review these training videos in the weeks leading up to Klondike. Unit Preparation

Preparing a Troop or Crew for an overnight snow camping adventure is no small task. It takes weeks of planning to be sure your unit is ready to take on the cold and possibly wet weather. Be prepared by planning in advance, following the Guide to Safe Scouting, and checking the type of clothing to be worn by your scouts.

It may be a good idea to plan a unit snow camping outing prior to the Klondike where your scouts can have a trial run setting up their gear in the snow while staying close to the cars. Once at Klondike, they will be hiking nearly a mile in the snow to get from the parking area to their campsite. Better to find any issues ahead of time

PATROLS COMPETE FOR PRECIOUS GOLD

EVENTS!

Rail Spike Drive – Visit Caribou Crossing where construction is underway on the White Pass and Yukon Railroad. Test your patrol's strength and accuracy to see if you can drive a rail spike into a wooden tie.

Log Saw – The Dawson Lumber Mill will host the log saw. Use an eight-foot long back saw to cut a tamarack log. When you're done, brand the round with the BSA emblem and keep it as a patrol souvenir.

Fire Building – Out in the wild Yukon, show that your patrol has what it takes to build a fire in the harsh conditions and that you can work as a team.

 $\pmb{\mathsf{Log}}$ $\pmb{\mathsf{Lift}}$ – The pioneering spirit continues in Nome, Alaska with the knot tying competition.

Snow Cannons – New recruits are needed at Fort St. Michael. Both accuracy and distance will be needed to keep the local bears at bay with precision snow balls.

Morse Code – The telegraph office in Bennett, British Columbia is looking for new telegraph operators. See if your patrol can successfully transmit and receive messages using Morse code.

Tomahawk Throw — Head East to the village of Teslin where you can test your skill at traditional hunting. In this event patrols will see who can stick a tomahawk in the target, and closest to the center.

Snowshoe Race – With all these new prospectors seeking to strike it rich, it's a race to the gold fields! Here at Chilcoot Pass, see how quickly you can navigate a course in the snow while wearing a pair of snow shoes.

Additional events may be added. Final event list is subject to change.

THE GREAT SLED RACE

SATURDAY AFTERNOON

Starting in Whitehorse, this event will challenge your Patrol's physical endurance, teamwork, and scout skills. For this event you will need a sled capable of transporting one of your patrol members plus some essential patrol supplies.

CLAIM A TOWN

Want to run an event at the Klondike? Have an idea for a new event? New Mayors are appreciated. Claim an available town or start your own. Contact the council office for more information or register as staff if you would just like to help.

Registration Deadline

Carrying out an event like this takes many months of planning and preparation. To help the planning committee anticipate the number of attendees and properly prepare for the event, we ask that you register early. All those registered by February 2°d, 2024 will receive a \$10.00 discount per person off the regular registration price. You can still register after that, but will be charged the full price. We recommend registering what youth and adults you can early, and you can always register additional attendees as the event gets closer. Don't over estimate though. We may not be able to offer refunds if you end up bringing less people than you registered. Registering early also ensures that you will receive any event updates that are emailed out.


